**AGREED ORDER ON DEFENDANT'S  
MOTION FOR PERMISSION TO TRAVEL**

THIS CAUSE was heard by the Court on August 14, 2013 upon the Defendant's Motion for Permission to Travel. At the hearing, the defense filed with the Court a letter from Dr. George Burnazian, a treating physician of Harriett S. Goodman, the Defendant's mother. The letter informed the Court of Ms. Goodman's medical condition. According to Dr. Burnazian, Ms. Goodman was recently diagnosed with a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] which is aggressive in nature. Dr. Burnazian's letter also stated that Ms. Goodman's condition was too severe to allow her to survive being medically transported to Florida.

At the hearing on this Motion, the State announced that it had no objection in principle to the Motion, provided certain conditions were ordered and followed. The parties also informed the Court that they had been in consultation with the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, which agreed to provide law enforcement assistance with logistics and personnel to accompany the Defendant to Houston, Texas to visit his mother. The parties also advised the Court that the Defendant will bear the financial

responsibility for the travel arrangements consistent with this Order.

The Court announced that it was inclined to grant the motion, provided the parties were able to reach agreement on the conditions under which the travel is to take place.

The Court has been advised by the parties that they have reached an agreement on said conditions. The Court has reviewed the agreed-upon conditions and is satisfied that they are sufficient to ensure that the Defendant will be in the care, custody and control of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office at all times during travel to and from Houston, Texas, and while the Defendant is in Houston, Texas to visit his mother. The Court had initially ordered that the Defendant and accompanying Palm Beach County Sheriff's deputies travel on a commercial airline carrier. However, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has requested this Court to reconsider its initial order. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has made arrangements for travel via a charter aircraft. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has undertaken this responsibility. The Court is satisfied that, with the charter arrangements being made exclusively through the Sheriff's Office, the Court's initial concerns about travel via charter aircraft have been resolved, and the Defendant shall be allowed to travel via charter aircraft as arranged by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office.

Accordingly, and upon the agreement of the parties, the Court grants the Motion for Permission to Travel and imposes the following conditions:

1. The Defendant shall be allowed to travel from Palm Beach County to Houston, Texas for a period of four (4) days. It is anticipated that the Defendant will depart Palm Beach County on August 16, 2013 and return on August 19, 2013. However, if travel arrangements consistent with this

order have not been finalized in order to allow for departure on August 16, 2013, or if this order is not signed in order to allow for departure on August 16, 2013, then the effective dates of travel will be adjusted in order for the defendant to depart on a date other than August 16, 2013 and return four (4) days later. However, the period of travel is restricted to four (4) days.

2. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office will arrange for transportation to and from Houston, and will make all travel and lodging arrangements. The defendant shall be accompanied by four (4) Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office deputies. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is ordered to have the Defendant in its care, custody and control twenty-four (24) hours per day for the entire four (4) day period. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office will be responsible for implementing and carrying out security measures which will ensure compliance with this order.
3. The Defendant will be responsible for payment of all travel, lodging and meal expenses of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office consistent with this order. Appropriate arrangements have been made between the Defendant and the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office consistent with this order.
4. As the Defendant is currently on house arrest with an ankle bracelet and monitor through the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, and as the Defendant will be in the care, custody and control of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office during this four (4) day period of travel, the Court orders that the house arrest and monitoring procedures shall be suspended during the

period of travel. Upon his return to Palm Beach County, the currently imposed conditions will be reinstated.

ORDERED and ADJUDGED that said Motion be and the same is hereby granted subject to the terms and conditions stated above.
